BACKGROUND:

The Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (Plan) is required by the federal government for each jurisdiction. The previous Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan for the County was developed in 2018. The current Plan is a five-year revision of

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that Plan that is required by federal regulations. The Plan recommends hazard mitigation actions, and sets goals and objectives, that will protect people and property affected by natural or manmade disasters in the City of La Mesa and other jurisdictions within the County. Having this plan in place also satisfies requirements for the City to obtain federal and state assistance in the event of a disaster, or when applying for grant funding for certain City projects. This Plan has been written after over a year of development by the County of San Diego and jurisdictions within the County. The State of California and FEMA have reviewed the plan and have tentatively approved it pending its adoption by each jurisdiction.
